



A discussion about the **Teach A Kid To Fly Program** was engaged in by the members in attendance. Questions about the 2019 Program were addressed to and answered by Rick Witherow who indicated that he believed that the 2020 Program should be conducted over fewer months. Rick also suggested that training sessions be scheduled for early in the evening when wind conditions are more conducive to flying. More information will be forthcoming. Rick is planning to hold a meeting in February to discuss the details of the 2020 Program.

Jason reported on the status of the Salisbury University Grant designed to fund the acquisition and deployment of a radio controlled aircraft. The University is willing to continue the funding commitment while an aircraft is identified.

Jason reported that he had received informal info that **Wings And Wheels** will not be held at the Salisbury Airport this year. He has a contact within the staff of the Georgetown Airport who indicated that Georgetown might hold a similar event there. Jason will keep the members informed as he obtains further information.

Ray Carlson reported that conversation with Capt Willy of WBOC revealed that the episode that they filmed of the MARKS Annual Airshow was his favorite episode. With that in mind, Ray mentioned the importance of making contact with Capt Willy prior to the 2020 Show.

Jason responded to a question about the status of a private airshow at the nursing home in Snow Hill. He indicated that there was sufficient albeit minimal area for flying smaller aircraft and that management of the facility were fairly flexible as to when the event could occur.

Rick Witherow raised the topic of float flying

indicating his disappointment that earlier plans had not happened. He indicated that he had plans to install floats on an aircraft with the specific purpose of flying off water. Jason talked about a location on the Pocomoke River that is possibly available to the Club for a specific function. Jason has a relationship with the owner of the property and can coordinate the event.

All Season Flying patches received from the AMA were distributed to members present.

There being no further business, a motion was made, seconded, and passed to adjourn the meeting.
