JASON SHOWS HIS ZIROLI C-47 TO THE MEMBERS ~

Immediately following the April membership meeting, Jason showed his recently complete Ziroli C-47 to those in attendance. Jason provided the following:

The aircraft was purchased from club member Fred White after many years was spent on the build. I purchased it with the aircraft in primer color with mainly the final scale and paint items needed to be completed.

The Aircraft is powered by 2 DLE 35RA engines turning 17x10 semi scale props with a single fuel tank located in the center section supplying fuel. I spent the last year in scale appearance and upgrades.


The initial color scheme was chosen to mirror C-47 KILROY

Dealing, which has been known to be on several of my giant scale warbirds, and the tail number, which represents my AMA number.

I spent over 3 months just in panel line and rivet details. The panel lines were created by applying 1/32 chart tape to the aircraft, painting with high build primer, then lightly sanding to leave the indentation in the paint. The rivets were applied drop by drop using a syringe and canopy glue. Overall the entire aircraft has over 6000 hand applied rivets.

The paint used for the aircraft is Krylon flat spray-paints. The markings are also painted using paint mask which Wally assisted and donated to the project. The entire aircraft was coated in Krylon ultra flat clear to blend all of the colors.

All Hitec digital servos were used for the airframe. The servos are powered using a Smart Fly comp 12 power board, a pin and flag switch, and 2 Fromeco 5200 lion batteries. The ignition system uses 2 Fromeco 2600 lion packs, a Smart Fly battery share, and A smart Fly dual ignition Fiber optic kill switch. The retracts are Robart electric with a 5200 7.2 lion pack. The custom lighting system uses 3







led lights for the wing and tail navigation lights, and 2 Cree 1 inch 1300 lumen for the landing lights. The landing lights are controlled using a Rexel ignition kill switch mixed with the flap channel. The aircraft also features a side door that is controlled by a servo via a switch on the transmitter.

The overall aircraft weight came out to be around 57 lbs. I will be heading to the Fredericksburg RC club in mid May to test fly and obtain the AMA Large model aircraft documentation.
